Arizona Revegetation & Monitoring provides monitoring on 20-25 vegetative transects yearly on ranches within the District. The focus is on US National Forest grazing permits but private land is also monitored. The data gathered can be used by the Forest Service and Cooperators to evaluate trends on key areas for livestock grazing.
