



The Santa Cruz NRCD provides monitoring on 20 vegetative transects yearly on District ranches. The focus is on National Forest grazing permittees and the data gathered can be used to defend renewal of grazing permits against actions of litigious environment groups which have a goal of removing livestock grazing from rangeland.
